



# **COMPETITION SECTION - HORSFALL TURNER ESSAY PRIZE RULES**

### <u>Aims</u>

The Horsfall Turner essay prize is a prestigious award given to the best essay submission on a given topic every year. It is designed to encourage trainee solicitors to engage with competition and European law. See below for details of this year's prize

### <u>Prizes</u>

The entrants will be judged by the Competition Section Essay sub-committee - all entrants identities will be removed before judging. The chosen winners will each:

- receive an invitation to the Competition Section Annual Dinner and Awards taking place on Wednesday 22 November 2017 at the Law Society. All prize winners will be seated on the Competition Section Chair's table, the same as the keynote speaker.
- 2. receive their award from the keynote speaker on stage
- 3. receive either the first prize cheque of £1,000 or highly commended prize cheque for £250

### <u>Rules</u>

- 4. Essays shall be no more than 2,500 words in length, should be in Microsoft Word, fully annotated and referenced.
- 5. Entries must be sent as an electronic file (see details in entry form below), to be received no later than 5.00pm on Monday 9 October 2017. When submitting an entry, the entrant shall confirm his or her agreement to comply with the Rules of the Horsfall Turner Essay Prize.
- 6. Entrants must be trainee solicitors or paralegals/stagiaires working at law firms or organisations which have an office in the UK. Trainees who qualify shortly before the closing date are eligible to submit an entry, provided he or she has indicated his or her intention to submit an entry prior to qualifying. Entrants shall on request provide proof of status and for this purpose we will accept the name and e-mail address of a partner in the entrant's law firm/organisation who may be contacted for the sole purpose of confirming that status.
- 7. The work must be the sole creation and original work of the entrant. It must not have been published before in any media, legal or otherwise.
- 8. The decision of the panel of judges is final and is not subject to appeal.
- 9. It is a condition of the competition that, while the entrant will retain copyright in the work, the Section will have the right to publish the winning essay free of charge.
