Horsfall Turner essay prize

The Horsfall Turner essay prize is a prestigious award presented to the best essay submission by a trainee solicitor on a given topic every year. It is designed to encourage young lawyers to engage with competition and European law.

The first prize is £1,000 plus one (or two) highly commended prize/s of £250. All winners are invited as guests to the Competition Section's Annual Dinner, where their prizes are presented by the keynote speaker which this year will be Christina Blacklaws.

Earlier this year, experts from the European Commission (EC) and a UK Digital Competition Expert Panel both made recommendations to adapt competition law and policy to the challenges of the digital era. Do you think the EC was right to propose a presumption of anti-competitive conduct, effectively shifting the burden of proof for pro-competitive benefits onto platform operators?

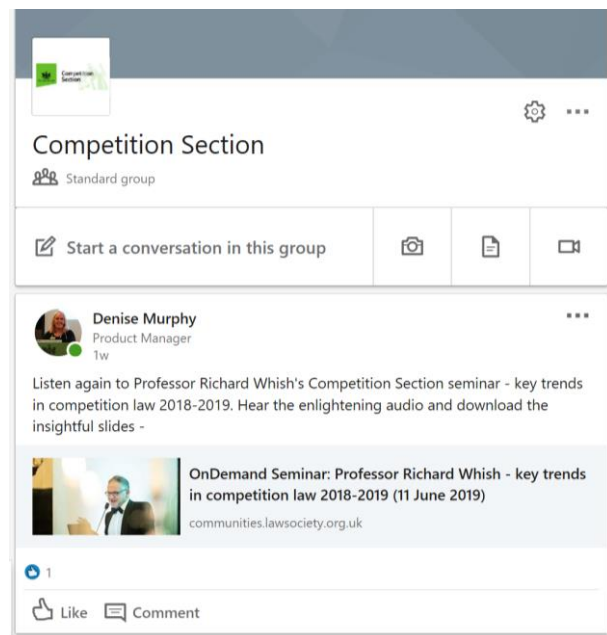

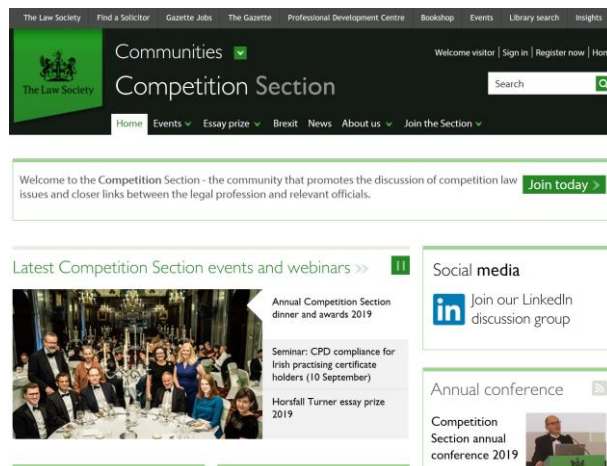
